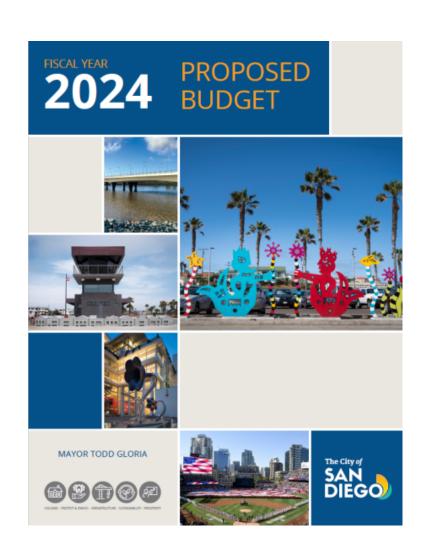
Mission and Vision

- Opened and improved several parks in partnership with Engineering and Capital Projects
- Hosted the Farmers Insurance Open at Torrey Pines Golf Course
